
The Importance of Boundaries


Thank you to Stephanie, one of our own from RDR, for asking us to discuss this topic.

As much as we want to cuddle our big fur-babies and show them all the love and affection we can muster, it's also equally important to establish strict boundaries to ensure that your pup knows who's in charge and their place within their home and pack. Dogs are naturally packanimals, and a hierarchy is always established and necessary in a pack to keep everyone in line. This is no different when these dogs are domesticated, they still look for a leader. When a leader is not established, and boundaries are not set, your dog may take it upon themselves to fill the role. This can lead to issues when it comes to other dogs and can make this an unsafe environment for you and your pet. One way you can counter a dog from trying to become the alpha and 'playing by their own rules' is to establish boundaries.

What are boundaries?

Boundaries are the same whether you're dealing with humans or dogs, or just animals in general. It's an unwritten rule that establishes what you won't allow in specific settings. For pets, this can include things like, but is not limited to, the following:





- Crate training, in general,
- Not allowing a dog to rush a door whenever you open it,
- Making the dog sit/stay for a treat or reward.

There's plenty of other things you can do to establish boundaries. All of which are important in teaching your pet their place in your home and your pack. These boundaries can also help your pet better assimilate to a new environment if you have to move or if you take them to a new place where they may be nervous or uncomfortable like a vet's office or a dog park.

Establishing boundaries also increases the bond between pet and owner because you are telling your pet the rules and helping them trust you as their leader. All they want is to make you happy, so these will likely be easier to enforce when your pet is positively rewarded for respecting your boundaries. For example, if you want them to stop rushing

the door, you can use their favorite treat as a reward each time they sit patiently while you open the door rather than just scolding them for rushing the door. It is much easier to set these boundaries in place when a dog is younger, but don't



be fooled; old dogs CAN learn new tricks and will be just as easy to teach the rules as a puppy. Maybe, sometimes, easier!

One of the tips from world-renowned dog trainer Cesar Milan to setting boundaries, aside from claiming your space, teaching your dog to wait, correcting at the right time and being consistent includes taking the lead:

"To help give your dog boundaries, you need to emphasize that you are the Pack Leader, and a great way to do this is by creating the rule that you always go through a door first. You may need to start teaching your dog this with him on-leash, making him stop and wait at each threshold. After you go through, then you invite him to follow. Of course, the best way to be a Pack Leader is to give your dog exercise through the walk several times every single day, and teaching your dog to wait at doorways is a great way to help him learn how to follow you on the walk."

Setting a boundary will depend on your dog and the home environment you want to create. Whichever way you choose to establish boundaries, make sure they are done with love and in the best interest of all humans and animals involved. A trainer may be able to give you advice on which boundaries are important for your pet to learn and can help you with tricks on staying consistent with setting them. All dogs can benefit from boundaries.






